

# Researcher Recruitment: Bulgaria

SOS Children's Villages: Evaluation

### Background

The Research Base is an international research consultancy based in the United Kingdom. We are currently carrying out an evaluation on behalf of **SOS Children's Villages** in Bulgaria (as well as Hungary). The SOS Children's Villages programme recently moved its foster family programme from Dren to the Pernik region and to Sofia. It was hoped that the move would instigate positive changes to the lives of the children, improving social integration, access to community services and contact with original families. It was also hoped to enhance the programme delivery by improving efficiency, foster parent recruitment and local collaboration, and reducing costs. We will be conducting desk research and analysis, but require assistance from local researchers to deliver a series of in-country interviews and face-to-face surveys with programme participants (children, young people and families) in Pernik and Sofia and other community stakeholders.

#### **Roles & Responsibilities**

We require two local researchers (one male; one female) to work with us, delivering interviews and primary research in Bulgaria. Face-to-face training will be provided to the selected researchers by The Research Base in early February 2016.

Researchers will then carry out interviews with a range of stakeholders over a six week period, beginning immediately after the training. These interviews will seek to gain a qualitative perspective on the programme, obtaining perceptions of impact, as well as answers to questions around effectiveness, efficiency, relevance and sustainability.

Once trained and conducting interviews, researchers will be required to report daily to The Research Base, providing recordings of any interviews and allowing any questions to be answered and issues to be raised. As well as being remunerated at competitive rates (see below), researchers will receive a letter of recommendation from The Research Base, following successful delivery of the project, to facilitate future employment.

#### **Researcher Specification**

As capacity development is a central part of this project, we aim to provide training and support to researchers who will benefit from early career experience and training opportunities. Training and support will be provided by The Research Base and this is an opportunity for trainee researchers to get hands-on experience of data collection and fieldwork. The table below clarifies the applicant requirements, including both essential and desirable criteria.

#### Remuneration

Researchers will be remunerated at GBP 100 per day. Each day is equal to eight hours and a total of 4.5 days will be required from each researcher. This will comprise:

- 1.5 days (up to 12 hours) in early February (dates are to be confirmed but are likely to be the week commencing 6th February).
- Up to 3 days (24 hours) in the six weeks following.

Researchers will be required to generate an invoice on completion of the interviews and provision of acceptable data. Invoice templates will be provided on request and invoices will be paid by international bank transfer within 30 days of receipt.
